E-Cigarette Waste

Electronic cigarettes (E-cigarettes) contain lithium batteries, plastic, and chemicals that negatively impact the environment.

Do NOT throw away e-cigarettes in the trash can or recycling bin!

If not disposed of properly, e-cigarettes can potentially lead to landfill fires and release chemicals and micro plastics to the environment.

Try reaching out to your local E-cigarette company to see if they offer a resource for proper disposal

DID YOU KNOW?

In the 2020 Keep America Beautiful National Litter Study, 9 out of 10 littered items counted were 4" and less, with cigarette butts being the number one littered item in this category, accounting for 9.7 billion butts counted on any given day in the United States.

Keep America Beautiful has reported a 50% decrease in cigarette litter in the areas where they have implemented their Cigarette Litter Prevention Program

HOW YOU CAN CONTRIBUTE

Fortunately, TerraCycle offers a free program that accepts cigarette waste for disposal. Simply collect the cigarette butts, print their free shipping label, and they take care of the rest! It's that easy! For every pound of cigarette waste sent \$1.00 is donated towards the Keep America Beautiful Cigarette Litter Prevention Program!

What the Monongalia County SWA Accomplished in 2025

It was an amazing, and busy year with many successful accomplishments in 2025. The table to the right shows the outcomes from 2021 – 2025 with the Paper Shred and Electronics Collection Events and the Community Reusable Latex Paint Program data on each calendar page.

Events – this year was the first year we offered two paper shred and two electronics recycling collection events! Then, we screened latex paint for our reusable latex paint program at Friends of Deckers Creek Paint Exchange. We held two pick up for residents to pick up reusable latex paint.

Increased “Getting the Word Out about Events” and Education Information

Here are some of the activities we accomplished in 2025 to reach residents

- Created a 2025 Schedule of Events and added it to MUB’s billing mailer and passed out at events
- Created a Spring & Fall Collection Events and Paint Pick Up Event Banner at the Recycle Center

- Wrote and designed the How To Reduce, Reuse and Properly Dispose of Latex Paint article and ad

How to dispose of Propane tanks?



Propane and Helium Tanks

Propane and helium tanks, including small camping propane canisters, should be disposed of at a household hazardous waste collection event.

During the year, check to see if the manufacturers' or local stores' have a recycle, refill, or reuse program (some do).

Try This Instead

- Buy helium balloons at the store
- Rent a reusable helium tank

The **Monongalia County SWA** does **NOT** provide household hazardous waste collection.

Plan Ahead Tips!

When purchasing *hard to recycle and hard to properly dispose of items*

- Ask a knowledgeable person **at the store** about any recycle, reuse or refill programs **they provide**
 - Some **local** stores do have these options
- Check the product's website for recycling, reuse, or refill programs



Fire Extinguishers

Fire Extinguishers should be disposed of at a household hazardous waste collection event or **during the year**, Fire Extinguishers can be recharged (to save money instead of buying a new one), recycled or disposed of at:

- **JT Martin Fire and Safety**, Clarksburg, WV
- **A & I Fire Extinguisher**, Uniontown, PA

Single-use household batteries

Single-use household batteries are usually accepted at the household hazardous waste collection event.

During the year, residents can recycle single-use batteries at:

Plan Ahead

The Monongalia County SWA Paper Shred and Electronics Recycle Events kick off our first collection events of the year making it a perfect time to share *How to Prepare for the Hard to Recycle and Hard to Dispose of Items Collection Events*. To prepare, residents will want to Plan Ahead, Review the List of Accepted Items, Know Participation and Safety Guidelines, and Keep Informed.

Tips to Plan Ahead

- **Mark the event date, time and location on your calendar.**

- **Review the List of Accepted Items** to make sure the items you are bringing will be accepted.

Review the List of Accepted Items

It is important for residents to *Review the List of Accepted Items* before the collection event. The List of Accepted Items is on the website of the organization holding the collection event. We recommend residents also review the *List of Items Not Accepted*. If an item is not on the list residents should contact the organization hosting the event.

How To Reduce, Reuse and Properly Dispose of Latex Paint

In July, Friends of Deekers Creek held their annual Paint Exchange. It was the perfect time to share how to Reduce, Reuse and Properly Dispose of Latex Paint and explain how a Paint Exchange works. Did you know that 80 million gallons, or 10%, of paint purchased by consumers goes unused. It makes sense if you're not sure how much paint you need for that room, wall or project. There's even with knowing how much you need, you find yourself with leftover paint. Here are some tips on how to reduce, reuse and properly dispose of latex paint. First, Buy What You Need. Then, Store Properly. Use Up Leftover Paint. Share for Reuse. Dispose of Properly.

Buy What You Need
To reduce the amount of leftover paint from your project, begin by finding out how much you need. There are several ways to find out, but the first step is to measure the area you plan to paint. Then, go to your favorite hardware or paint store to see if they have a Paint Calculator. Many have name stores, and paint companies, but this tool and they are very easy to use. If you would rather not take the computer or do the math, take the measurements to the store and talk to the paint salesperson. They will be able to guide you. It's likely you'll still have leftover paint. If you plan to keep for touch-ups, other projects, or to share for reuse, you will want to make sure to store your paint properly.

Store Properly
To make sure your paint is good to use or reuse later, you will want to store it properly. There are various specific

recommendations depending on the paint brand or read the label or ask the paint salesperson. However, there are some consistent general tips. For example, maintain the seal by using a paint key (instead of a screwdriver to avoid damaging the seal and air) close the lid properly (clean off excess paint from lid, rim and label and use a cloth to wipe the lid to place). You want a tight seal, store in a temperature-controlled environment to keep it from extreme cold and heat, and from direct sunlight. Then, find the best storage area away from moisture, kids and pets.

Use Up Leftover Paint
If you don't want to store leftover paint, look around for places for reuse. If you have a small amount of paint, take off the lid and let it dry out and harden. For more tips about how to reduce, reuse and properly dispose of latex paint contact the Monongalia County SWA.

Share for Reuse
The Friends of Deekers Creek Paint Exchange is an event where residents can "exchange" latex paint by dropping off and picking up paint that has already been dropped off. Residents do not have to exchange latex paint to participate. Residents can just drop by and drop off latex paint or pick up paint for free. Latex paint that is left at the end of the event will be collected by the Monongalia County SWA to create a Community Paint Reuse Program to provide to residents, non-profits and other organizations. Details are coming soon. If you don't want to store, use up or share for reuse then you'll want to dispose of your latex paint properly.

Dispose of Properly
Latex paint can easily be disposed of properly because it is a water-based paint. Unlike oil-based paint, which is a "hazardous waste," latex paint only needs to be dried out and hardened. It can then be tossed in your regular trash. Check with your trash hauler to learn how they want you to place latex paint in the trash. The most important thing is that the paint is completely dried out and hardened. A few ways to dry out paint are to use absorbent, like cat litter or shredded paper to absorb the liquid, or use a paint hardener or for a small amount of paint, take off the lid and let it dry out and harden. More About the Monongalia County SWA

The **Monongalia County Solid Waste Authority** was created by the West Virginia Legislature on January 1, 1989, as a public agency in accordance with WV Code §22C-4-3. The Legislative intent was to protect the public health and welfare with a comprehensive program of solid waste collection, processing, recycling, and disposal, managed for the most part, on the local level. Responsibilities of the authorities include but are not limited to acquisition, construction of and/or operation of solid waste facilities; local and/or regional solid waste planning; siting approval of commercial solid waste facilities; coordinating public education and awareness; solid waste and litter control project coordination/ management and many other things consistent with WV Code §22C-4.

The purpose of the Monongalia County Solid Waste Authority is to protect the public health and welfare by providing for a comprehensive program of solid waste collection, processing, recycling, and disposal. Further, the Monongalia County SWA exists to establish programs based on source reduction, recycling, reuse, material recover and lastly, landfilling.

The Monongalia County SWA has a five-member board of directors who are in charge of managing the powers and duties of the Monongalia County SWA. These board members are appointed by different agencies which include: the Secretary of the WV Department of Environmental Protection, the Monongalia County Commission, the board of supervisors for the Monongahela Conservation District, and the chairman of the Public Service Commission.

(NOT accepted at the Mountaineer Transfer Station)

Appliances with freon like refrigerators, freezers, window air conditioners and dehumidifiers need to be disposed of or recycled properly.

- Appliances with freon can be dropped off at **Appliance Discounters**, in Westover, for free.
- Most appliance retailers will haul away an appliance for a small fee when you purchase a new one.
